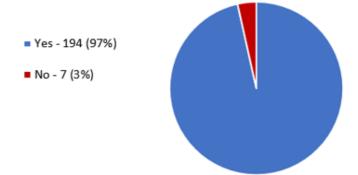


3. Questions and Results

 - (j) home inspections unless two staff perform the inspection?

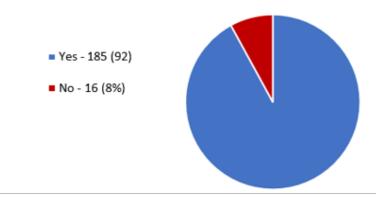

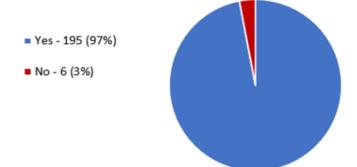

 - (c) taking the usual or rostered meal or other break and instead taking the break at an earlier or later time?

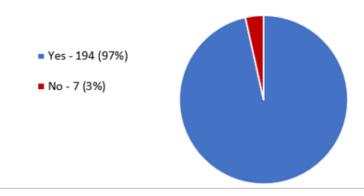

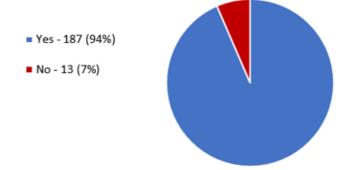
